






ABOUT THE ARTISTS

HANS ZIMMER composer

Hans Zimmer has scored more than 200 projects across all mediums, which, combined, have grossed more than \$28 billion at the worldwide box office. Zimmer has been honoured with an Academy Award®, two Golden Globes®, three Grammys®, an American Music Award, and a Tony® Award. His work highlights include Gladiator, The Thin Red Line, As Good as It Gets, Rain Man, The Dark Knight trilogy, Inception, Thelma and Louise, The Last Samurai, 12 Years A Slave, Blade Runner 2049 (co-scored with Benjamin Wallfisch) and Dunkirk.

In 2019, Zimmer scored the live-action remake of The Lion King, for which he received a Grammy® nomination for Best Score Soundtrack for Visual Media. Zimmer's films for 2020/2021 include Wonder Woman 1984, the James Bond film *No Time to Die*, Ron Howard's *Hillbilly Elegy*, Denis Villeneuve's *Dune*, *Top Gun: Maverick, The SpongeBob Movie: Sponge on the Run*, and *The Boss Baby: Family Business*.

Zimmer has completed highly successful tour stops for his Hans Zimmer Live concert all around the world.





ABOUT THE ARTISTS

LISA GERRARD composer/soprano

With a vision and vocal style that is as unique as it is precise and all-embracing, Lisa Gerrard has established herself as one of the world's most highly acclaimed film composers, winning a Golden Globe for her work on the score for *Gladiator* with Hans Zimmer.

Her musical journey began in the early 1980s when she and fellow Australian Brendan Perry formed duo Dead Can Dance. In 2012 the band reunited for a sell-out world tour. With nine albums released between 1984 and 1995, the duo's musical canvas expanded with each release to take in a timeless mix of world-music influences, medieval chants, folk ballads, baroque stylings, Celtic flavours, electronics, samples and anything else that took their fancy.

Several solo and collaborative albums were wellreceived and Lisa made a natural progression to composing for films. Lisa's film work includes *Whale Rider*, a feature which received an Academy Award nomination and garnered Lisa an international award for the score. In 2009 she scored the highly acclaimed feature *Balibo* for which she won the 2009 Screen Music Award for Best Feature Film Score, an ARIA Award and three further nominations. In 2011 she completed the score for *Burning Man* which won her Best Music Score at the 2011 Film Critics Circle of Australia Awards. In 2016 she collaborated with Marcello De Francisci on the score for the feature *Jane Got a Gun* directed by Gavin O'Connor and starring Natalie Portman and Ewan McGregor.

Lisa has collaborated with James Orr on a number of scores, including Paul Currie's 2016 thriller 2:22. In 2017 they completed the score to *West of Sunshine*, which premiered at the Venice International Film Festival. In 2019 they scored the television series *Secret Bridesmaids' Business*, which aired in Australia on Channel 7. The original soundtrack for the series was released with Air-Edel Records.

Most recently, Lisa collaborated with Lorenzo Esposito to co-compose and perform vocals on *100 Preludi*, directed by Alessandra Pescetta. The film premiered at Sguardi Altrove Film Festival in 2024.

Lisa's vocal performances continue to be heard across the world. She performed as part of *Gladiator Live* at The Royal Albert Hall in London in 2018 and as part of *The World of Hans Zimmer – A Symphonic Celebration* tour. Lisa and David Kuckhermann received a Grammy nomination for Best New Age Album for *Hiraeth*, which was released on Besant Hall Records, sub-label of Air-Edel Records in August 2018.

In 2021 and 2024 she was a featured vocalist on the score for *Dune* and *Dune: Part Two*, directed by Denis Villeneuve.

JUSTIN FREER

American composer/conductor Justin Freer was born and raised in Huntington Beach, CA. He has established himself as one of the West Coast's most exciting musical voices and is a highly sought-after conductor and producer of film music concerts around the world. Freer began his formal studies on trumpet, but quickly turned to piano and composition, composing his first work at eleven and giving his professional conducting debut at sixteen.

Continually composing for various different mediums, he has written music for world-renowned trumpeters Doc Severinsen and Jens Lindemann and continues to be in demand as a composer and conductor for everything from orchestral literature to chamber music around the world.

He has served as composer for several independent films and has written motion picture advertising music for some of 20th Century Fox Studios' biggest campaigns including *Avatar, The Day the Earth Stood Still, Aliens in the Attic.* As a conductor Freer has appeared with some of the most well-known orchestras in the world including the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Cleveland Orchestra, London Philharmonic, Los Angeles Philharmonic, New York Philharmonic and the Philadelphia Orchestra. He is also one of the only conductors to have ever conducted in both the ancient Colosseum and Circus Maximus in Rome.



Freer has been recognized with numerous grants and awards from organizations including ASCAP, BMI, the Society of Composers and Lyricists and the Henry Mancini Estate. He is the Founder and President of CineConcerts, a company dedicated to the preservation and concert presentation of film, curating and conducting hundreds Concert (Digital), The Polar Express in Concert, Rudy in Concert, The Passion of the Christ in Concert, The Da Vinci Code in Concert, The Harry Potter Film Concert Series, Gladiator Live, The Godfather Live, It's a Wonderful Life in Concert, DreamWorks Animation In Concert, Star Trek: The Ultimate Voyage 50th Anniversary Concert Tour, Breakfast at Tiffany's in Concert and A Christmas Dream Live

ABOUT CINECONCERTS

BRADY BEAUBIEN

A Stanford graduate and All-American athlete, Brady Beaubien studied cognitive neuroscience before founding Interlace Media, an award-winning motion graphics company.

As a premiere CG animation studio and creative agency for feature films, Interlace defined the global campaigns of over 100 major Hollywood movies, including the *Avatar, X-Men, Rio, Ice Age* and *Die Hard* franchises.

In 2013 Beaubien co-founded CineConcerts, a company dedicated to reinventing the experience of theatrical presentation and orchestral music. He currently produces CineConcerts' full repertoire of film-concert experiences, including *Gladiator Live, The Godfather Live, DreamWorks Animation in Concert, Elf in Concert,* and the entire *Harry Potter Film Concert Series.*

Beaubien helps lead the company's vision for immersive XR technology and innovative presentations of media, including writing *Star Trek: The Ultimate Voyage*, a live concert experience that celebrates 50 years of iconic material. He also works to ensure that CineConcerts inspires a return to communal entertainment and continues to offer modern audiences and the world's youth a chance to reconnect with concert halls and local orchestras.

Beaubien is a member of YPO Beverly Hills and is on the board of several companies dedicated to Web3 and frontier technologies.

Beaubien is also accomplished in the world of architectural design, with his projects including Matsuhisa Paris at the Le Royal Monceau-Raffles and The Citrus on Hollywood's Melrose Avenue, an impassioned commercial structure that represents a commitment to the metropolitan providence of Los Angeles. At The Citrus, advanced technologies merge with wood, glass, and Japanese gardens, in an organic and modernist design. Additionally, Beaubien partnered with world renown sushi chef Nobu Matsuhisa to personally design his new restaurant concept in the picturesque building.

Beaubien lives in Massachusetts and California, with his wife Emmy and their two children, Archer and Channing.



ABOUT THE ARTISTS

BENJAMIN NORTHEY conductor

Australian conductor Benjamin Northey is the Chief Conductor of the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra, Conductor in Residence of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra and Principal Conductor, Artistic Advisor – Learning and Engagement of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra. From 2019-2023 he was the Principal Conductor in Residence of the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, having previously held the posts of Associate Conductor (2010-2019), Resident Guest Conductor of the Australia Pro Arte Chamber Orchestra (2002-2006) and Principal Guest Conductor of the Melbourne Chamber Orchestra (2007-2010).

As of 2025 he is the Artistic Director of the Australian Conducting Academy, a national training program for Australian and New Zealand conductors.

Northey studied conducting at Finland's Sibelius Academy with Professors Leif Segerstam and Atso Almila after being accepted as the highest placed applicant in 2002. He completed his studies at the Stockholm Royal College of Music with Jorma Panula in 2006 before returning home to Australia, where he has become one of the most sought-after conductors in the Asia-Pacific region.

He previously studied conducting with John Hopkins OBE at the University of Melbourne Conservatorium of Music, graduating with a Master's degree in 2002. In 2009/10 he was invited as one of three conductors worldwide to participate in the Allianz International Conductor's Academy with the London Philharmonic Orchestra and the Philharmonia Orchestra, where he was mentored by Vladimir Jurowsky and Christof von Dohnányi.

Northey appears regularly as a guest conductor with all the major Australian symphony orchestras. His opera credits include La bohème, Turandot, L'elisir d'amore, Don Giovanni, Così fan tutte, Carmen (Opera Australia), Sweeney Todd (New Zealand Opera), La sonnambula, L'elisir d'amore, Les Contes d'Hoffmann (State Opera South Australia) and Candide, Into the Woods (Victorian Opera).

His international appearances include concerts with the London Philharmonic Orchestra, the Tokyo Philharmonic Orchestra, the Mozarteum Orchestra Salzburg, the Hong Kong Philharmonic, the National Symphony Orchestra of Colombia, the Malaysian Philharmonic and the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra.

Northey has collaborated with a broad range of leading artists including Pinchas Zukerman, Maxim Vengerov, Anne-Sofie von Otter, Julian Rachlin, Karen Gomyo, Piers Lane, Alban Gerhardt, Johannes Moser, William Barton, Lu Siquing, Amy Dickson, Slava Grigoryan, Marc-André Hamelin, James Morrison, Kurt Elling, Archie Roach, Ben Folds, Nick Cave & Warren Ellis, Paul Grabowsky, Tim Minchin, kd Lang, Patti Austin, Kate Miller-Heidke, Megan Washington, Barry Humphries, Meow Meow and Tori Amos.

Northey is highly active in the performance and recording of new Australian orchestral music, having premiered dozens of major new works by Australian composers. He has also been active in music education and training through concerts and workshops for the Melbourne, West Australian and Sydney Youth Orchestras, the Australian National Academy of Music, the Australian Youth Orchestra, the University of Melbourne Conservatorium of Music and Monash University.

An ARIA Awards, AIR Music Awards, and Art Music Awards winner, he was voted *Limelight Magazine's* Australian Artist of the Year in 2018. Northey's many recordings can be found on ABC Classics.

In 2025, he conducts the Melbourne, Sydney, Queensland, Tasmanian and Christchurch Symphony Orchestras and the Hong Kong Philharmonic.

Sydney Philharmonia Choirs presents the art of choral singing at the highest standard, and develops the talents of those with a passion for singing in Sydney and beyond. Founded in 1920 as Hurlstone Park Choral Society, it has become Australia's finest choral organisation and is a Resident Company of the Sydney Opera House. Led by Artistic and Music Director Brett Weymark OAM and Associate Music Director Dr Elizabeth Scott, Sydney Philharmonia Choirs comprises three auditioned and three community choirs that perform repertoire from choral classics to musical theatre and commissions by Australian composers. It presents its own season of concerts as well as collaborating with leading conductors, soloists and orchestras.

Sydney Philharmonia Choirs first appeared with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra when it was an ABC orchestra. In 1941, the ABC awarded it the contract as the ABC choir, beginning an enduring relationship as the choir for the SSO which continues to today.

In 2002, Sydney Philharmonia Choirs was the first Australian choir to sing at the BBC Proms (Mahler's Eighth Symphony under Sir Simon Rattle), returning again in 2010 to celebrate the Choirs' 90th anniversary. In 2020 the Choirs celebrated their centenary with an inspiring commissioning project – *100 Minutes of New Australian Music*. In 2024 the new Emerging Composer Awards and Choral Conducting Fellowship programs were launched.

In 2025, SPC's season includes great choral masterpieces including Bach's St Matthew Passion and Christmas Oratorio, Charles Tippet's *A Child of Our Time*, Brahms' A *German Requiem*, and ChorusOz to sing Vaughan Williams' *A Sea Symphony*.

ELIZABETH SCOTT chorus master Associate Music Director Sydney Philharmonia Choirs

Elizabeth Scott is a highly skilful choral conductor who has led Sydney Philharmonia Choirs' young adult choir VOX since 2008. A former SPC Assistant Chorus Master (2006 –2008) and Acting Music Director (2013), she was appointed Associate Music Director in 2022. She is a Lecturer in Conducting at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music (University of Sydney) and has been the Choral Director of the NSW Schools Spectacular (NSW Department of Education) since 2009.

After graduating from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music in 1995, she completed postgraduate studies in choral conducting, vocal performance and aural training in Hungary and Germany. Elizabeth is a graduate of Symphony Australia's Conductor Development Program and holds a Doctorate of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting.

Elizabeth is a regular chorus master for the Sydney Symphony Orchestra and has previously prepared choirs for Sir Simon Rattle, Simone Young and David Robertson.

Appearing recently as a guest conductor for the Canberra Symphony Orchestra and the National Youth Choir of Australia, Elizabeth also regularly works with Gondwana Choirs and Cantillation.

Recent performance highlights include 2022's Mozart: Requiem & Revelations and Bach Mass in B Minor, Berliner Messe and St John's Passion Reimagined (2021), Considering Matthew Shepherd (2020) and Music at the Movies (2019).
